The action opens in a local cemetery (there are several, all of them picturesque).



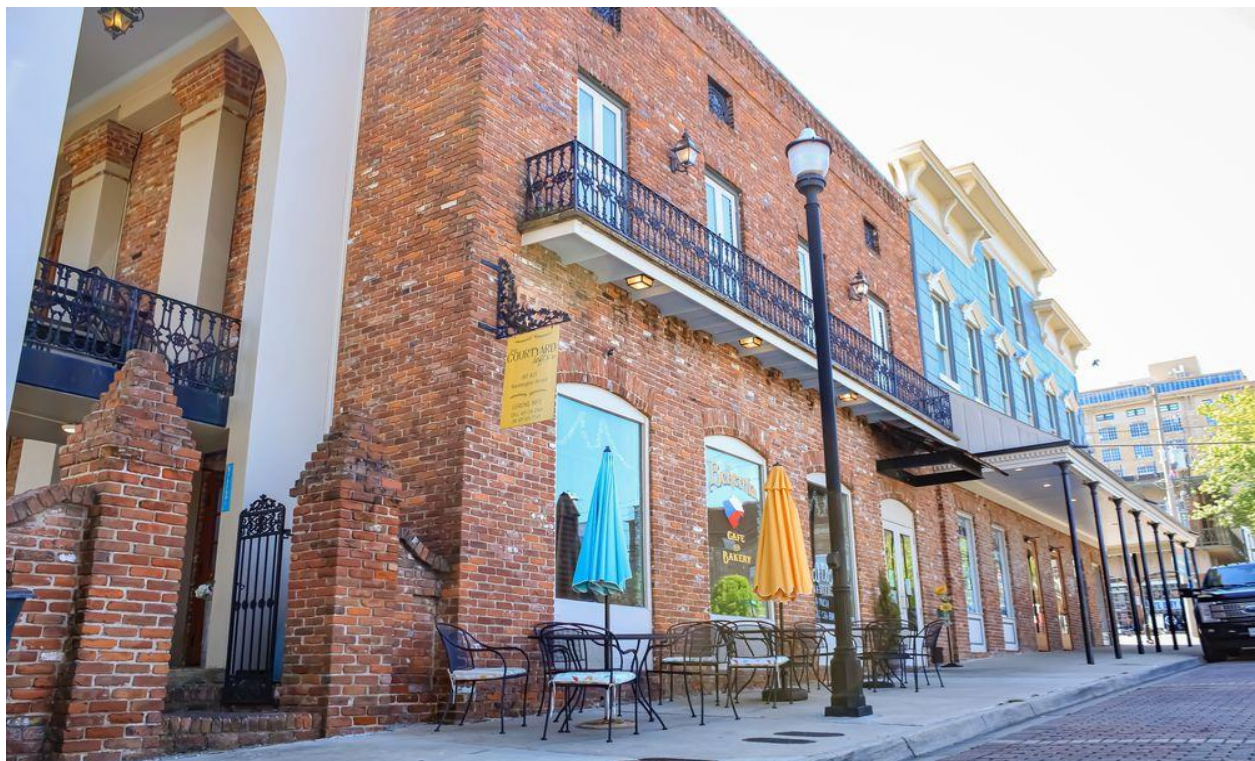

With a brief stop at a local cemetery. Dare I say, for some haunting music?



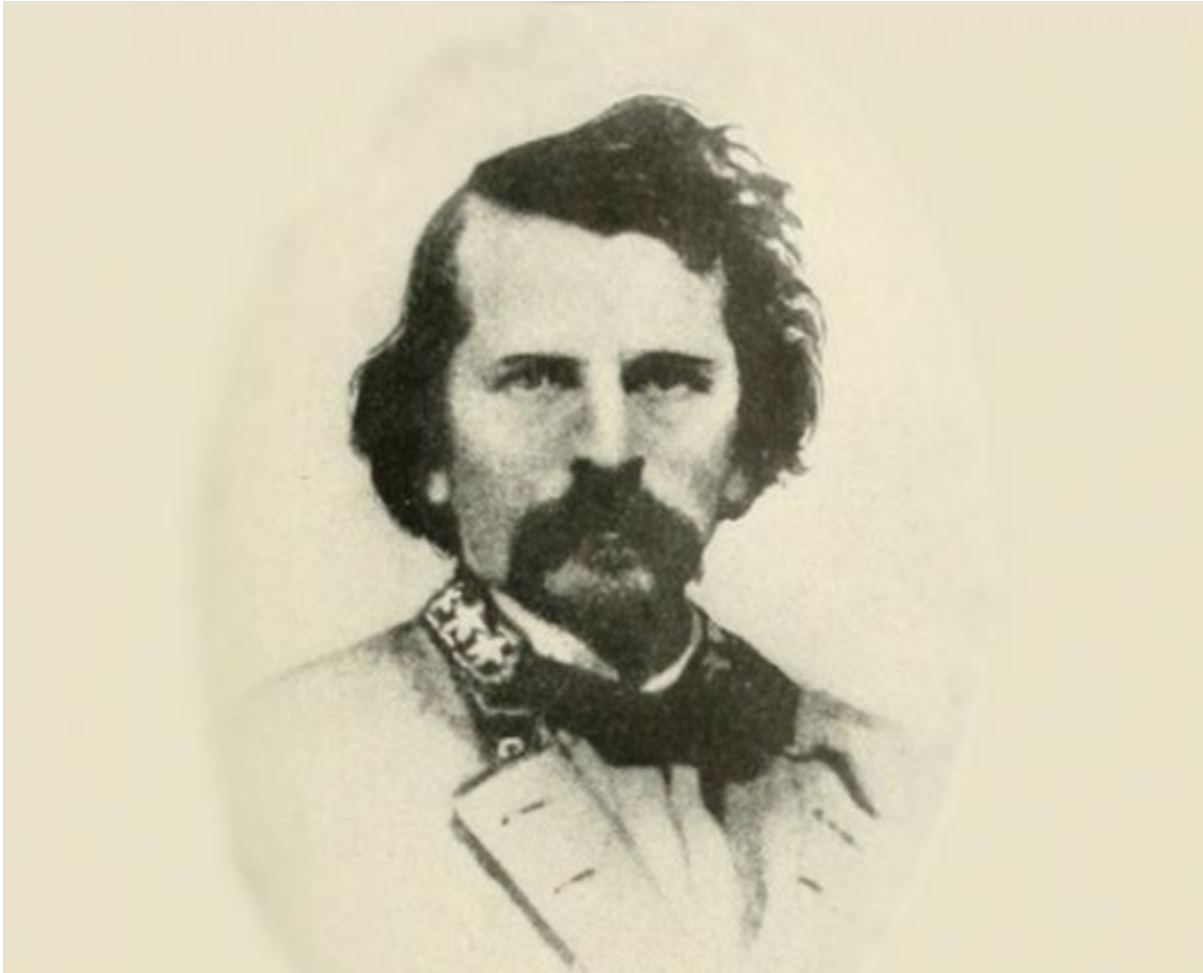
Chased every which way by the vengeful Confederate calvary.
